From College Application and Exploration Week to College Decision Day and FAFSA registration events, the school ensures comprehensive support for every student's postsecondary journey.

Unique programs like Aviation Maintenance Technology and Entrepreneurship and Innovation courses enrich students' career prospects. Dual enrollment options, readiness assessments, and utilization of Txt-4-Success further empower students to navigate the path to higher education confidently. Spring Valley's impact is tangible, with over 5,671 hours dedicated to GEAR UP programs last year alone. Notably, during College Application and Exploration Week, seniors submitted 350 applications—a testament to the school's transformative efforts.

Amid national trends of lower college enrollment rates, Spring Valley High School shines as a champion for college access and success, poised to inspire more students to embrace the promise of higher education.

INSIGHTS FROM STUDENT VOICES



As part of West Virginia GEAR UP's efforts to provide meaningful, engaging and enriching programming for students that increases their knowledge and excitement about postsecondary programs, West Virginia GEAR UP regularly surveys students about their thoughts on GEAR UP, their postsecondary plans and their thoughts on college. Their voices give us valuable insight into what students are looking for when thinking about their education and career plans after high school and what sort of activities persuade them to start planning for their future success.

Travel and Exposure:

For many students in West Virginia, the world beyond their immediate surroundings can seem distant and inaccessible. Yet, as one insightful eighth-grader articulated, opportunities to travel provide a window of boundless opportunities available beyond their hometown and serve as a motivator.

"We live in a fairly small town. We don't have a lot to do. So, I feel like whenever kids get these opportunities to see the big world, what lies out there, I feel like it definitely gives them motivation."



These experiences not only broaden perspectives but also instill a sense of ambition and possibility.





Pursuing Dreams through Higher Education

The promise of a brighter future often drives GEAR UP students to aspire to higher education. From trade schools to community colleges, the desire to further their education is palpable. As one eighth-grader expressed,

"I'd like to do something after high school – like trade school, a community college, whatever it is, an online college, something."

Their aspirations are not only driven by personal ambition but also by familial pride, as one eighth grade student highlighted,

"[My family] said that's a good idea [to pursue a degree] and that they're proud of me because I'll be the first college graduate out of them."

Sparking Interests through Various Pathways

A key component of West Virginia GEAR UP is exposing students to a variety of career pathways and opportunities they may not have discovered yet. Visits to technical and vocational schools provide invaluable insights into potential career trajectories outside of the traditional four-year college mold. One eighth grader expressed enthusiasm after visiting a trade school on a GEAR UP sponsored college visit.

"We went to the trade school and there were people that would explain different types of careers. I learned what it was like being in a trade school. I've been to a college before, but I haven't been [to a trade school] before. I liked what it was."

The Importance of Security and Opportunity

When choosing what to do after high school, GEAR UP is finding that today's students are thinking about their future job opportunities as well as potential income. One West Virginia GEAR UP senior explained why she decided to pursue a degree as a lab technician over a degree in education,"

"[The] program is 2 years, and it has a 100% hiring rate. Most of the people that are graduating from that program right now already have jobs. So, I won't ever have to really worry about job security."

Additionally, students favor earning money while also obtaining a degree or certificate. One 12th grade student stated that,

"I can get a degree in welding and also make money while doing it. So, trade school really caught my eye."

Understanding Student Needs

For students, the appeal of higher education lies in the prospect of acquiring skills that will lead to a stable career that earns them a suitable living. Insights gained from listening to students allows us to better understand what drives students towards postsecondary education. From this information we can provide more opportunities for students to explore the various pathways available to them right here in the Mountain State. It is imperative that students not only understand the avenues available to them, but that they can also see themselves attending school and being in a career that brings them life-long success.

One of the program's standout features is its accessibility. Students and parents can opt-in to receive these informative texts, and they have the liberty to reach out with any college-related queries at their convenience, knowing that a college access advisor is just a text away.
