

College for West Virginia (CFWV) coordinates three annual college-planning milestones to help students in West Virginia plan their pathway to education or training beyond high school.

High schools that successfully participate in all three of these pathway events will be recognized as a CFWV Champion of College Access and Success.

The three milestone events

The three milestones are College Application & Exploration Week, a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Completion Campaign, and College Decision Day. Each of these milestones has specific components to help college-bound students in West Virginia transition to college.







 - College for West Virginia (CFWV) coordinates three annual college and career planning
 milestones to help students plan their pathway to education or training beyond high
 school. Middle schools participating in all three of these pathway events will be recognized as
 CFWV Champions of College and Career Readiness and Success.
 - Three Milestones: College Application & Exploration Week (participation and completion of post-event survey), Completing the College-Going Culture Survey and completing a school-wide College-Going Culture Project (details to come), and organizing a school-wide Career Day. Each milestone has specific components to help students become career-ready and college-bound. Toolkits will be created soon. Registration will be released this summer.

CFWV Champions Expansion Launching Fall 2025

- Elementary School Expansion
 - Award Title: CFWV Champions of Career Readiness & Success
 - Award: TBD
 - What does it take to be an Elementary School Champion?
 - College for West Virginia (CFWV) coordinates three annual college and career planning
 milestones to help students plan their pathway to education or training beyond high
 school. Elementary schools participating in all three of these pathway events will be recognized
 as CFWV Champions of College and Career Readiness and Success.
 - Three Milestones: College Application & Exploration Week (participation and completion of post-event survey), organizing a college or career visitation day (virtual or in person) (details to come), and organizing a school-wide Proclamation Day (Similar to a College Decision Day. Details to come). Each milestone has specific components to help students become career-ready and college-bound. Toolkits will be created soon. Registration will be released this summer.

- 1. Students must apply to Promise or Invests; they don't necessarily have to qualify.
- 2. Students need to complete all three milestones or activities.
- 3. Students need to stay opted into the texting program. If they "STOP OUT," they will be disqualified from 21st Century Scholars. They can opt back in by registering again if they have already opted out.
- 4. Please note that a texting column is now on FAMS.
- 5. I will have a survey/form for you to complete the week of April 15th to submit your cord orders, so they are delivered to you in time for graduation. You will determine your number based on the information found in FAMS. Students must have opted and stayed in the texting program, submitted a FAFSA, and applied for either Promise or Invests. You can determine this via FAMS. This provides students time to complete the Promise (deadline of March 1), Invests (priority date of April 15), and FAFSA.
- 6. There is no cost to the schools or counties for the cords.

West Virginia FAFSA Day provides schools and organizations with the opportunity to assist students and their families in navigating the process of completing the FAFSA. This year's WV FAFSA Day will be held on Thursday, February 6th. Schools, higher education institutions, organizations, and community groups are encouraged to register to host an event focused on FAFSA and financial aid for West Virginia FAFSA Day.


